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Process

Corentin Laplanche Tsutsui lives and works in Marseille. His practice, which includes films, installations, photographs and derivative objects, is a composite of the visual arts, from analog to digital, from material to virtual. It falls within the field of research-creation, and thus calls on academic disciplines such as the history of forms and urban theories. He is involved in contemporary reflection on habitability, particularly in global cities. Through his projects, he proposes a reflection on spatial policies.

It is with a critical fascination that he observes and deconstructs the metropolises he inhabits or travels through. His projects propose both historical and speculative narratives, in his films or in the exhibition space, through a spatial and material narrative that passes through and between images and installations. Today, he brings these metropolitan fragments together in the speculative Composite City.

Composite City Stadium is a multi-language speculative short documentary, its story unfolds along two narrative spaces. In 1989, in a stadium in Osaka, property developers built a house expo in the place of a baseball field.

It was never to be dwelled, only visited,

1:1 scaled models sold to be rebuilt elsewhere.

In a speculative future, "players" activate the «Composite City Archive»: an immersive performance and experience in which the history of the Osaka Stadium is told to them through different devices, and where their reactions are recorded. Soon, their own storylines intertwine in the apparatus and overlap with the history of the site. Two conceptions of global metropolises are confronted in this movie:

the cold, concrete like one of the architecture itself, and the human's perspectives of how it is lived.

The evolution of the site in Osaka tells both about the history of the architecture of capitalism and the one of postwar Japan.

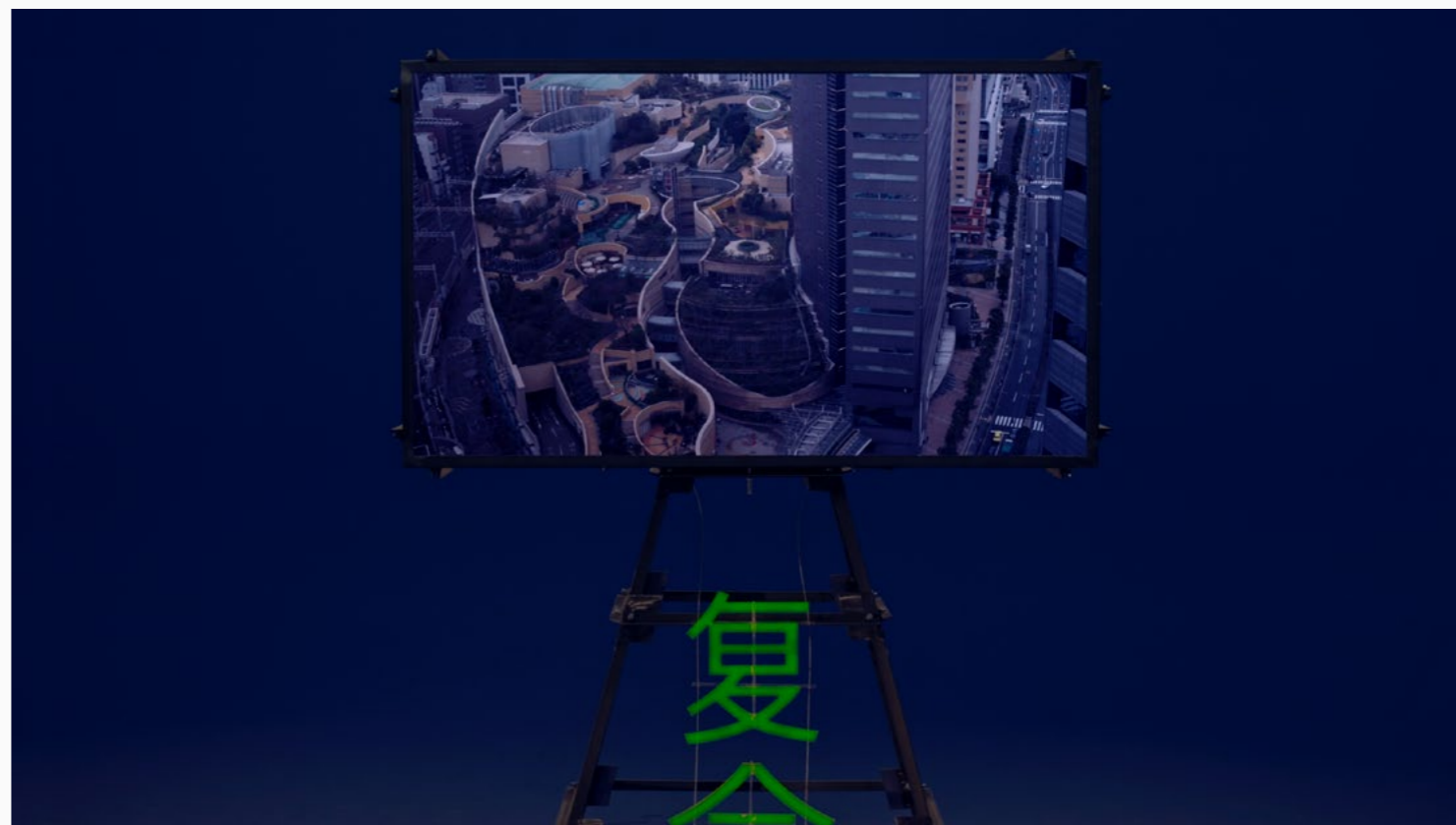
Composite City Stadium is a post-contemporary tale of habitability. It opens a difficult question: what does it mean to live and dwell in the metropolises that already exist, and in the ones to come?

This short film is part of a movie-based project *Composite City*, which will gather video installations, sculptures, stage performance and a feature film.

Cast shadows

“*Cast Shadows* is made of a big structure in galvanized steel, partly covered with scaffolding nets, and lit from the inside by LED light strips. From either sides, two back-lit photographs of a worksite around a pagoda in Tokyo - right before and right after lights out - held by reinforcing bars. This structure, reincorporating and exhibiting codes from both architecture and construction through its forms and materials, offers a sort of *mise en abyme*.”

An elaboration principle that unfolds in his new movie project, that will contain the sculptural elements of the set Corentin Laplanche Tsutsui called the «Composite City».

It is about a futuristic and archaic world-metropole where the modern would have swallowed the traditionnal, just like this scaffolding skeleton holding a pagoda, where the ghostly cast shadow of the Temple Asakusa is projected on the net, in the greyness of a *low tech* night.

A night quivering, says the artist, of the «sensitive variations on the rods and cones of my retina, of which I attempt to render the vibration in the digital noise».”

Apparatus, a movie-interview

I conceive a capture-device.
A mirror-image forms on the frosted
glass of the Pentax Asahi 67
and I shoot the outcome of the passing
of the light through its mechanism.

Three objects are designed
for the Dispositif : the plate of a desk
in white melamine, drilled to let a vase
through, the model of a book in plaster
& the counter form of a cornice also
in plaster. Both latests are put
on the desk as part of the conversation.

I ask Theo Casciani about his writing
process, whereas I produce his desk.
He is writing a book about all sort
of models & modeling, the action
of which takes place in various
metropolises. I am writing the script
of a movie of which the narrative
evolves through the evolution
of an architectural model : receptacle
through which I weave various stories
of metropolitan experiences.
To his words answer my pictures.

It is in this « in between », in between
two books, two movies
& two lockdowns, that the conversation
takes place.

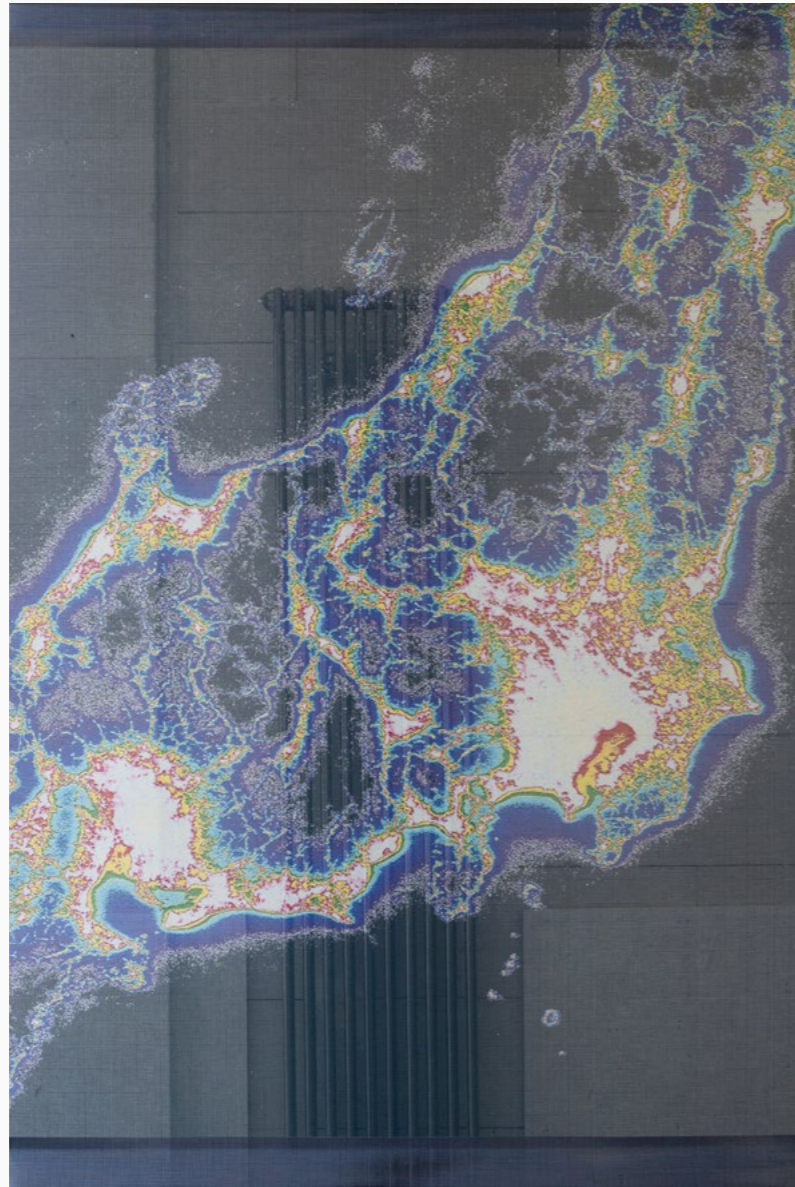

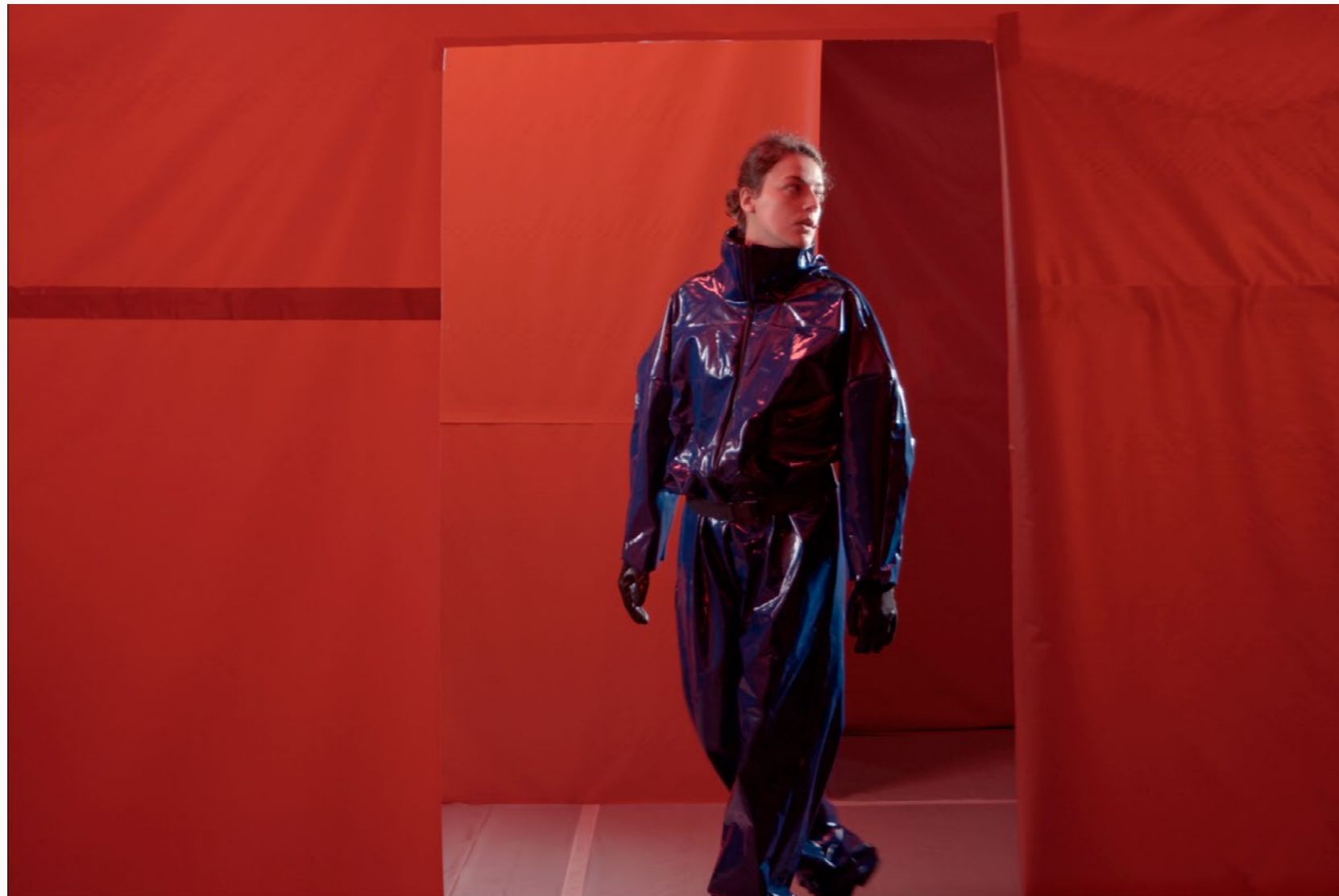

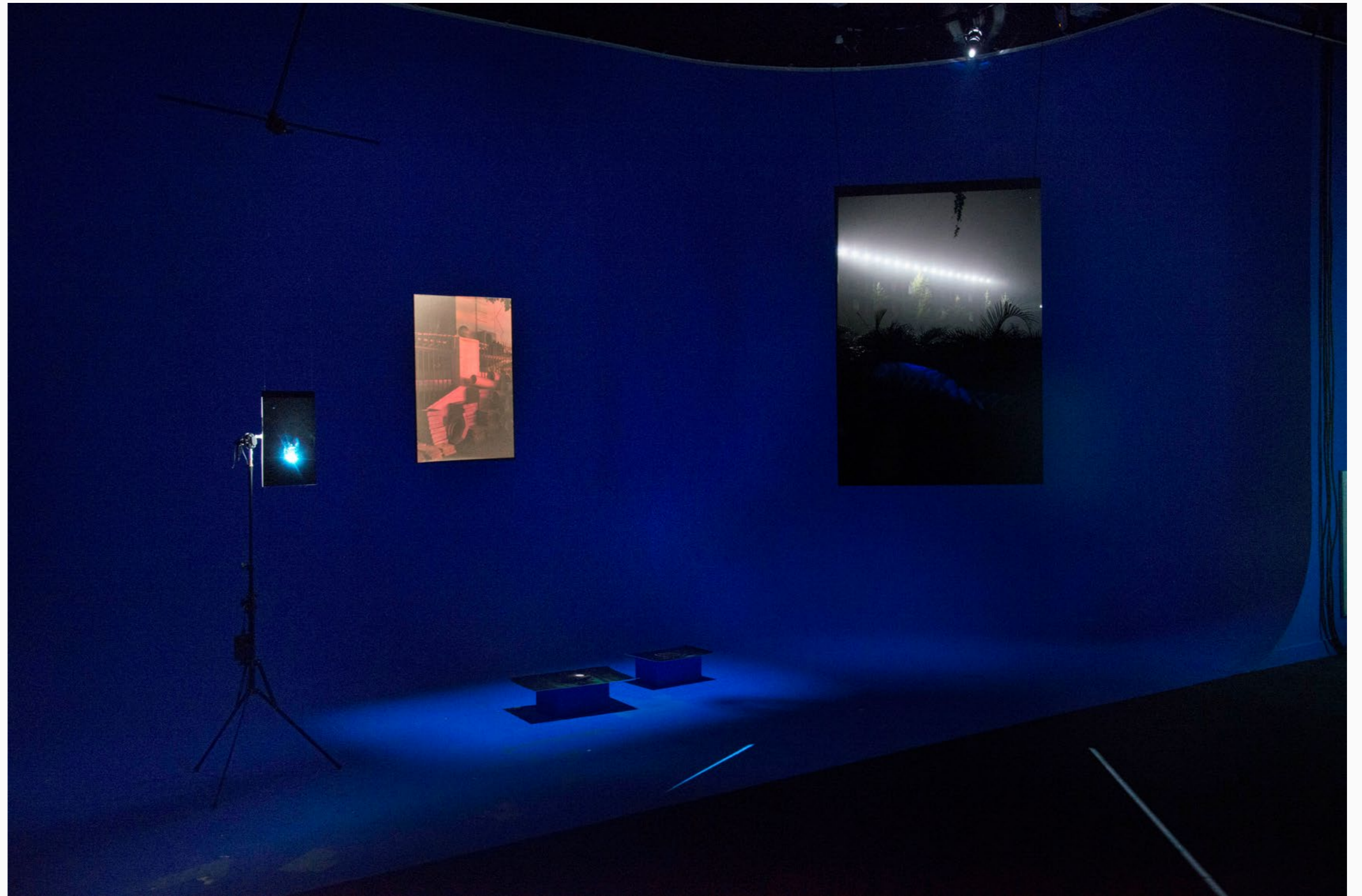
Between critical fascination & film index, the movie shows how ideology build its system through forms and their discourses : architectural, cinematographic, scientific & political

Part 1 : Tales from Black

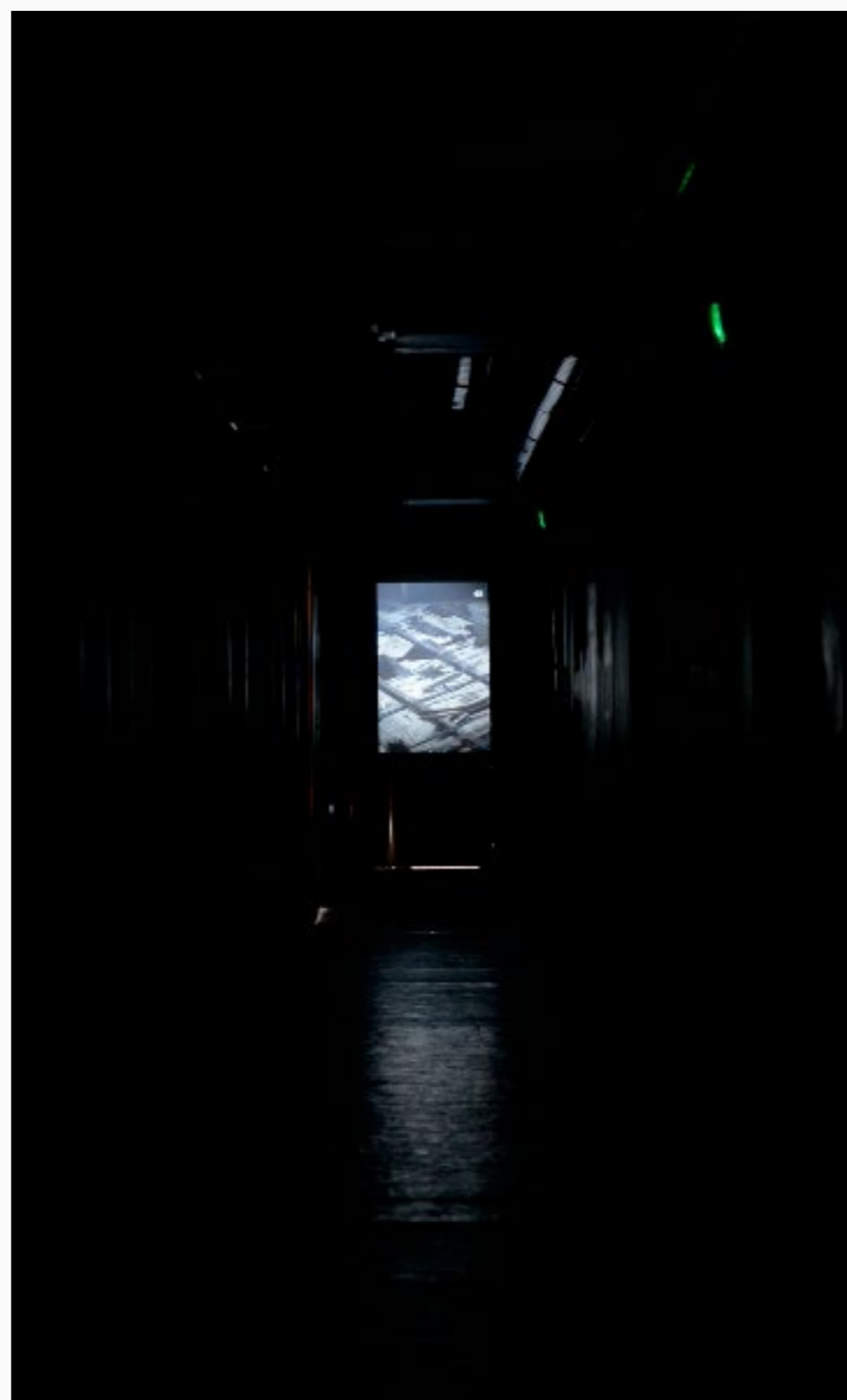
In the dim light, letters streams on glass, merging in a diaporama of photographs, captured between Hangzhou and Shanghai. The atmospheres melt and dialogue with the words, in a narrative made out of shadows and lights. Cities are recounted and comes into form, into light. Cities produced, sets on hold of a static movie, that projects their shadows and stream.

For this first part, the photographs are come from the set *Tales from Black*, and the poem of the same title. The text and part of the images are unpublished, and both mediums are for the first in my practice reunited in an installation.
